The REVIVE Program is designed to engage volunteer services for the delivery of therapeutic intervention in elderly patients to prevent delirium and increase the quality of life of elderly patients at the Prince of Wales Hospital.

Nancy Hillier (OAM), who was a long-standing active member of Orica's community committees, had made suggestions to the Prince of Wales Hospital Foundation to seek Orica's support for initiatives to improve aged care. She passed away in September 2013, and this community investment support has been made in recognition of her immense contribution to the community over many decades.
